## MONKEYPOX FOUND IN NEBRASKA, VACCINE ON THE WAY

Monkeypox, a disease which is part of the same family of viruses as smallpox, has been located in Nebraska. CDHD is advising the public to educate themselves on the symptoms of the virus and be aware that a vaccine exists if you are in a high-risk category.

The primary symptom of Monkeypox is a rash that can look like pimples or blisters that appear on the face, inside the mouth, hands, feet, chest, genitals and other parts of the body. Other symptoms include fever, headache, muscle aches, swollen lymph nodes, chills and exhaustion.



Novavax is a COVID-19 vaccine that is different from previously approved and authorized vaccines such as Pfizer-BioNTech and Moderna in that it does not utilize MRNA technology but is a protein-based vaccine, like other vaccines that have been used for decades.
